It can be accessed free of charge through a PC, laptop or via an app on a mobile phone or tablet. I have just had a meeting with the Education Director of BT and they are adopting Edmodo as their education platform too. Please do ask if your staff would like any training or help getting Edmodo set up. It is a great resource, free for us to use and is the world leader in learning platforms with 46 million users.

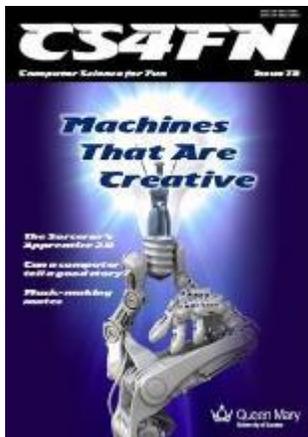




Edmodo for Parents gives an easy way for Education Fellowship parents to stay involved in their children's education. With ongoing updates, they can find out about:
