Key Stage 3 Computer Science Baseline Tests

There is a full Scheme of Work and lesson plans to complement the computer science baseline tests at <http://goo.gl/F4IU2P>

All are Creative Commons licensed so you can copy and edit anything.

The next baseline test is scheduled for February 2015 after which progress measures will be provided between tests. This will be automated so that as more tests are taken there will be a progress profile sent for each student and for the department. Over 3 years from year 7 to year 9 there will be six tests.

The Level 1 Open Systems computing qualification requires keeping some coursework along the way but the exam at the end will be very similar to the baseline test and grade candidates pass, merit, distinction, distinction* with league table points the same as for grades D-G at GCSE. This will not affect anyone taking GCSE Computing as the qualifications have different discount codes. Everything is optional.
